
Fraternity, Sorority and Cooperative Life Cost and Census Report



2020 - 2021 Purdue University

Housing Capacity

There are a total of 67 housed groups at Purdue University between the Interfraternity Council, Purdue Cooperative Council, and Panhellenic Association. Each year, these facilities are inspected by local fire departments for safety and max capacity. Below is the occupancy to capacity ratio for IFC fraternities, PHA sororities, and cooperatives from Fall 2020. MGC and NPHC organizations do not currently own or operate chapter facilities and have been excluded from this section of the report.

Cold air dorms are the most common type of sleeping quarters found in our facilities, with individual rooms (typically housing 2-4 members each) being the second most common. The majority of housed organizations also utilize large common areas to host events such as chapter meetings, ritual ceremonies, and philanthropies.

IFC Fraternities: 37 of 42 groups are currently housed.

Dues and Fees by Council

Multicultural Greek Council

There are 10 active Multicultural Greek Council chapters at Purdue University at the time of data collection. This council is comprised of organizations founded traditionally, though not exclusively in the Latinx, Asian/ Asian American/ Pacific Islander, LGBTQ+, and Multicultural traditions. The following data represents information from 8 of those groups.

Total Member Fees/ Semester	\$105 per semester

Most organizations offer payment plans for members, with smaller monthly payments instead of a lump sum payment at the beginning of the semester. Chapters also offer scholarships which can be applied to the cost of membership or registration for regional or national conferences.

National Pan-Hellenic Council

There are 7 active National Pan-Hellenic Council chapters at Purdue University as of the Fall of 2020. These organizations are historically, though not exclusively, African American and celebrate Black culture through service, civic engagement, and traditions. The following data represents information from 6 of those groups.

Organizations indicated scholarships were available for members to attend regional and national conferences; however, scholarships for dues were not listed as available to members.

All NPHC chapters are currently unhoused at Purdue. Four responding chapters did indicate interest in seeking housing opportunities for the organization.

Purdue Cooperative Council

There are 11 active Purdue Cooperative Council houses at Purdue University at the time of data collection. The following data represents information from 11 of those groups. It should be noted that Cooperative houses combine organization dues and housing fees into one comprehensive price. This is different than our housed IFC and PHA organizations and is denoted in the price guides.

The majority of cooperative houses have members live-in from the beginning of their new member semester through graduation. Some exceptions include live-out status for student teaching, co-op, and/or internship experiences; allowing a certain number of members to live-out (ranges from 0-10 members); and voting out members who do not uphold expectations of membership. The average number of members who can live in is 31.

All cooperatives have new members sign housing contracts during the spring semester for the coming year; most returning members' contracts are renewed along the same timeline. Deposits range from \$0 to \$500 paid during the member's first semester in the facility. Amenities all cooperative respondents have include internet, in-house laundry, and meals. Other common amenities include basic cable and parking at the facility.

All cooperative houses list scholarship opportunities to assist members with dues and house bills. Some houses have creative incentives to achieve academic success and scholarship, while others recognize leadership and service with monetary awards. Those houses that do not offer scholarships individually promote awards gifted through the Purdue Cooperative Council.

Interfraternity Council

There are 42 active Interfraternity Council chapters at Purdue University at the time of data collection. The following data represents information from 31 of those groups. The first table outlines typical costs associated with membership, including semester-dues and one-time fees. The second table highlights costs associated with living in a chapter facility. The third table breaks down overall costs of membership by status- out-of-house, new member, and in-house/initiated member.

Most housed groups offer comparable amenities to Purdue University Residences, including internet, laundry facilities, cable or satellite, and parking. The average facility currently houses 39 members, with as many as 85 comfortably. Information shared about total capacity indicates these chapters could house, on average, as many as 54. Most contracts for living in a facility are signed by members the semester immediately before occupying the house, with some as early as November or as late as mid-summer.

Most housed groups offer comparable amenities to Purdue University Residences, including internet, laundry facilities, cable or satellite, and parking. Most contracts for living in a facility are signed by members between the months of October and February. All Panhellenic facilities currently have a live-in house director whose primary responsibilities include supervising kitchen staff, serving as a host, and acting as a resource to those who live in the house.
